PEAT CUTTING

It is peat cutting season on Galson Estate! With the price of heating our homes at an all time high, more residents living on the estate are returning to cutting Peat cutting is still permitted in Scotland, however commission croftina guidelines state that it must be done sustainably. The traditional method of cutting peats using a tairsgeir and then reinstating the turf, is the most sustainable method and the method encouraged by UOG. Modern machinery based methods are convenient but not as effective preserving the fragile environment. Often. methods can be extremely damaging so all peat cutters are urged to cut sustainably where possible and always make an effort to reinstate the turf.

If you do wish to cut peats, please contact your grazing clerk for advice on which bank you are permitted to cut. The grazings committees manage the land where peat cutting takes place.

If you do not know who your grazings clerk is, UOG can provide this information.



GUNNERA

The weather has not been kind for gunnera spraying this summer. We need dry, calm conditions and those days have been few and far between. However, by the end of July we completed spraying plants Ballantrushal and Borve and are half way through Skigersta (which is by far the most covered village on the estate). Eorodale and Port of Ness will be next, weather permitting. Gunnera can be sprayed throughout September and even into October. If you have small plants in your garden or croft, they can be sprayed with Roundup weed killer which can be bought locally. If seed heads are present, they should be removed and disposed of in the organics bin prior to spraying

BUTT OF LEWIS LIGHTHOUSE DEVELOPMENT

As reported in our Spring newsletter funding had been received from HIE to use in addition to UOG funds to install a toilet facility at the Butt of Lewis. the facility has now been installed and is being well used by visitors to the area. We were unable to attract a food vendor to operate in the area for this summer but hope that this will be in place for 2025.

We have appointed a team of cleaners who have done a fantastic job of keeping all our visitor facilities in pristene condition.

Work is still ongoing with the Northern Lighthouse Board to obtain a lease to the Lighthouse buildings to allow full redevelopment of the site, progress is being made but it is a slow process.

VISIT NORTH LEWIS REBRAND

Feedback from local tourism operators has resulted in Visit Galson being rebranded as Visit North Lewis this year.

The website is currently under review and the social media pages are being populated to showcase all the area and local businesses have to offer.




Murdo Maclean | Board Member
