
## **SUMMER 2025**

The latest news from Urras Oighreachd Ghabhsainn (Galson Estate Trust)

After Storm Floris catapulted us into autumn, it provided a hasty warning to tidy up everything left lying around crofts and gardens.

It has been a great year for crops and stock, and a lot of sunshine has encouraged excellent produce in kitchen gardens and under cover. UOG follows these developments with interest and has a continuing interest in finding ways to encourage more use of croft land and gardens.

The school holidays started with a very successful Plòigh and working with several local partners, UOG delivered a full programme of activities at venues across the Estate, as well as subsidising activities with Ness F.C and Spòrsnis. Attendance levels were exceptional and the weather was kind, on most days!

You can read about all of these initiatives and other projects all for the benefit of the community, in this newsletter. This includes the Community Investment Fund which continues to provide important financial support to many local projects.

UOG is planning a major mixed use development project in Upper Barvas as part of its vision for the Galson Estate community.

A masterplan produced includes 30 homes, 16 extra-care units and a number of self-build plots together with commercial and community spaces. The total cost of the project is estimated at £35m with five different phases of development envisaged over the longer-term.

These proposals offer a range of housing types, including self-build plots, live/work possibilities and affordable homes, for inclusivity and long-term viability with modern methods of construction. Designing housing clusters with shared amenities will encourage a sense of community and collective ownership of resources. Introducing Live-Work opportunities through community and commercial spaces will attract and encourage more home-based microbusinesses and bring further diversification to the economic base of the area.

Housing has regularly been cited as a barrier to population growth and retention. To address this, an area of land was identified by the Upper Barvas Grazings Committee in 2017 for potential new housing. It was agreed that UOG, as the landowner, should develop initial proposals to cover a range of housing types and tenures, elderly care, childcare, support services and community outreach.

UOG's initiative coincided with Comhairle nan Eilean Siar (CnES) seeking to consolidate existing carebeds into one location in Stornoway and another location to serve rural Lewis. This site has since been acknowledged by CnES as a firm contender for any future extra-care facility for rural Lewis but the funding model to deliver such facilities has not yet been identified. UOG expects that these type of facilities could act as an anchor activity on the site around which would encourage further community health and wellbeing partners to co-locate over time.

Household and employer surveys have been completed to identify potential demand. There are around 28 households both within and outwith the Estate seeking housing solutions. These range from larger families requiring four-bedroom properties to young individuals aspiring to leave the parental home and start living independently. Only three of the respondents were on the HHP waiting list which shows the latent demand across the area. Employers have identified a need for a range of family-sized properties for rental to accommodate workers they are trying to attract to the area at times.

Another source of demand is renewable energy projects, particularly the proposed interconnector being progressed by SSEN. This could create 'legacy housing' for the community where properties would be available for local residents after the renewable energy contracts have been completed.

Promotion of these proposals has been carried out at agricultural and community events in recent months and a display of plans is available for viewing at the UOG Business Centre in South Galson.





### **Gunnera**

This summer's weather hasn't made our efforts to manage gunnera on the Estate any easier. Persistent rain, gales, and haar have left the ground saturated and often made it too windy to spray safely. We're now hoping for a calm, dry September to continue the work.

So far, we've managed to treat most of Borve and parts of Port and Skigersta, the three villages with the heaviest infestations.

If you have gunnera in your garden, please remove the seed heads, place them in a plastic bag, and dispose of them in your general waste bin. This helps reduce further seed dispersal. You can then treat the remaining plant with a weedkiller such as Roundup.



## <u>Deer management</u>

We're preparing for the 2025/2026 season. While stags can now be culled year-round, their meat isn't always suitable for consumption. However, the stags are currently in good condition, and our volunteer stalkers are already back out, when weather conditions allow.

The hind season begins on 21<sup>st</sup> October and runs through the winter until 15<sup>th</sup> February. NatureScot recently approved night licenses and continues to provide valuable guidance on cull targets.

### **Renewables**

UOG and its community partners, Urras Oighreachd Chàrlabhaigh and Urras Oighreachd Sgìre Bharabhais, continue to develop proposals for the West Coast Community Energy (WCCE) windfarm at Barvas Moor. It has been a busy summer with a series of deadlines in relation to the grid connections. Despite favourable offers being received from SSEN and the national grid operator (National Energy System Operator), the project has now been moved to a fall-back position due to the lack of capacity on the planned interconnector. It appears that three community-owned projects on the island will be denied access to the grid at this point. However, there is an expectation for changes to occur over the next five years and the WCCE partners are determined to continue with preparatory works. WCCE has just received a grant of £179,477 to assist with these preparatory works which will be focused on submission of a planning application in mid-2026.

## **Climate Hebrides Roadshow**



Designed to raise awareness, combat misinformation, and support local climate goals, the Climate Hebrides roadshow offers residents the opportunity to learn about electric vehicles, speak with experts, and even get behind the wheel.

The initiative is part of Climate Hebrides' broader mission to support communities across the Outer Hebrides in taking meaningful climate action. Its Climate Hub now has over 220 members across the island chain, including Galson Estate.

The EV Roadshow also supports Urras Olghreachd Ghabhsainn's Community Climate Action Plan by helping residents and staff explore practical steps toward reducing transport emissions.

Jemma MacVicar, Executive Manager, Urras Oighreachd Ghabhsainn, commented: "We're delighted to be working with Climate Hebrides to bring the roadshow to Galson Estate, particularly in light of our recent Community Climate Action Plan which highlighted a need for supporting people in the transition to electric vehicles to reduce carbon emissions and live in a sustainable way. This is a great opportunity for our community to explore the benefits of electric vehicles first hand; from lower running costs to reducing our environmental impact. Supporting sustainable transport options is a key part of our commitment to a greener, more resilient future for the estate."

All sessions are free to attend, with trained staff on hand to offer one-to-one test drives (insurance permitting), passenger rides, and advice on grants, charging, and ownership.



# A black pudding demo, maritime musings, spinning and song, and lots more during next month's Dùthchas!

Fancy learning how the Ness black pudding is made? Or what about joining conversations about a life at sea? Perhaps Gaelic song or ceilidh dancing is more your thing? Or what about making your own tweed cushion? As part of this year's Dùthchas, running from 6<sup>th</sup> - 13<sup>th</sup> September, you'll have the chance to do it all!

The black pudding demonstration will take place at Cross Stores on Wednesday 10th September at 10am, and visitors and locals alike are invited to learn how this traditional delicacy is made in a session that celebrates local culinary heritage.

Paddy Furey, owner of Cross Stores, commented: "Black pudding is more than just food here, it's part of our story. The way we make it in Ness and the recipe we follow has been passed down through generations, and it means a lot to be able to share some of the processes with people during Dùthchas - we might not be able to share our exact 'secret' recipe, we don't want to spoil the intrigue too much, but we will definitely share some of the processes behind our black pudding. Whether you're local or just visiting, pop in and see what helps to make our black pudding special, and you might even get a wee taste at the end!"

Dùthchas is a week-long festival celebrating the heritage of Galson Estate and this year we have another full programme of events, from guided historical walks and daily Gaelic lessons to ceilidh dancing, films, and more.

Other highlights of this year's festival include **Maritime Musings and Salty Snacks** on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> September at the Clan MacQuarrie Community Centre in Borve; an evening of conversation with Alastair Smith and John Smith who will regale the audience with their tales of a life at sea, accompanied by a selection of sea themed canapés, prepared by Paul Moorby. On Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> September, get a glimpse into the history of one of the island's key harbours when you join Dods Macfarlane for **A Seafarer's Stroll**. For those who enjoy a song or two, join Gaelic singer Elizabeth MacKenzie and spinner, Mary Smith for a unique event: **Spinning and Song** will give participants the opportunity to see Mary in action on the spinning wheel whilst Elizabeth shares some Gaelic spinning songs. There will be an illustrated talk with David Mackay, an experienced landscaper and arborist from Shader, **The Memory of Trees** on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> September, exploring the history of Hebridean woodlands and our Celtic connections to the natural world.

## A piece of maritime history returns to Port of Ness



A piece of maritime and meteorological history has returned to Port of Ness, as a working barometer, an exact replica of the original FitzRoy barometer, has been installed in its historic location, more than a century after the first was put in place.

The restoration was initiated by Angus Murray (Aonghas a' Ghaisean), whose family come from Port of Ness, who discovered a functioning barometer, an exact replica for the original, for sale online, after the original barometer had been taken out by Comunn Eachdraidh Nis to see whether repairs would be possible. Recognising its significance to Port of Ness, Angus approached Urras Oighreachd Ghabhsainn and the Trust funded the purchase and installation of the new barometer. Janet Macleod, Cultural Engagement Officer, Urras Oighreachd Ghabhsainn commented: "This barometer isn't just a scientific instrument, it's a cultural landmark. It connects us to the maritime heritage of our community and the pioneering work of Admiral Robert FitzRoy. We're thrilled to see a working barometer back in place for the local community and visitors to enjoy."

Admiral Robert FitzRoy, a pioneering meteorologist and naval officer, who invented this barometer, founded the Meteorological Office in 1854 and devoted his efforts to improving weather predictions for the benefit of mariners. FitzRoy's barometers were placed in fishing ports across Britain to provide local mariners with accurate weather forecasts, an innovation that saved countless lives.

The original Port of Ness barometer was installed in 1863 and remained under the care of the Met Office until 2024, when it was officially gifted to Comunn Eachdraidh Nis.

Janet Macleod, added: "We're very grateful to Angus for bringing this opportunity to us and for his dedication throughout the project. Special thanks also go to Donnie Campbell, whose expertise was invaluable during the sensitive installation process and to Derick Mackay for dressing the cabinet housing the barometer. Thanks also to local residents for their cooperation during the installation."

The barometer can now be viewed in its original location in Port of Ness. Those interested in learning more about its fascinating past can explore archival material at Comunn Eachdraidh Nis.
