### BÒIDHCHEAD AR SGÌRE & AN-DRÀSTA! FILM INVOLVEMENT WITH LOCAL YOUNG PEOPLE

In 2019, we were involved in the creation of two informative films, led and presented by young people.

As part of the Community LED by Energy Champions project, a 12-week filmmaking workshop ran for 14-24 year olds. The aim of the project was to create a climate change film that would be submitted to the FilmG awards 2020. Funding was received through the Climate Challenge Fund, Bòrd na Gàidhlig and Highlands and Islands Enterprise and the project was led by Urras Oighreachd Ghabhsainn.

'An-Dràsta!' was the outcome of this. A film highlighting the climate concerns of people living and working in the Outer Hebrides, it also permitted the young people a platform to express their views and concerns on the subject. It a group of local young people

has gone on to be screened at many local and national events, most recently being picked up by the Scottish Environmental Protection Agency (SEPA) and shared on to their social media platforms. It has now received two nominations in the FilmG shortlist - 'Best Dùthchas Film', reserved for films pertaining to heritage, culture and the ways people interact with their environment, and 'Best Performance' for Méabh, one of the young people involved. We are so pleased to announce that An-Dràsta was awarded in the 'Film Dùthchais' category (Best Heritage Film) at the FilmG Awards 2020 on the the Aspiring Communities Fund. 14th February in Glasgow.

The second film was 'Boidhchead ar Sgìre', 'Our Area's Beauty'. Showcasing local businesses and attractions in the Ness area,

present the entire film in Gaelic with English subtitles. Scripted, arranged and directed by Donna from Comunn Eachdraidh Nis with Gaelic support from Shona from the Urras and from Katy Graham from Comunn na Gàidhlig, it will be used as a resource by the Comunn Eachdraidh Nis Museum for the thousands of tourists who stop here in the summer months. Keith Morrison of WeeStudio recorded and edited the content, and Conal Ferguson of HebDrone provided the spectacular aerial footage. The film was made possible by the Calmac Community Fund and

# COMMUNITY LED BY CHAMPIONS PROJECT DRAWS TO A CLOSE





Our Community LED by Energy Champions project will conclude in March. The project, funded by the Climate Challenge Fund, aimed to increase carbon literacy and reduce carbon emissions across the Galson and Carloway Estate areas.

A few highlights from the past two years include:

- Over 350 referrals for home energy advice visits;
- LED bulbs delivered to over 225 homes;
- Two-day carbon literacy training delivered in both Carloway and Galson:
- Energy saving workshops planned for February;
- An-Dràsta! film produced by young volunteers and screened at venues across the islands.

### ECO SCHOOLS - LINDY'S UPDATE

UOG is working in partnership with Sgoil an Taobh Siar and Sgoil Lionail to support them to achieve their Eco Schools Green Flag Award. To date, the schools' Eco Committees have devised a whole school environmental review and a draft action plan to be submitted to Eco Schools. Once approved and implemented, both schools will be well on their way to achieving their award.

### PROGRESS WITH NEW BUSINESS CENTRE

Good progress has been achieved with replacing the business centre at South Galson over recent months. Planning permission and a building warrant have been secured which has enabled UOG to progress with tendering. Tenders have been issued to contractors and are due to be returned in late February. Once construction costs have been established, negotiations will be undertaken with the insurance company to finalise financing arrangements and, if all these steps proceed favourably, UOG hopes that construction can be underway in late Spring or early Summer. The proposed building is similar in size to the previous premises but the layout has been remodelled to create more flexible and open-plan accommodation.

# LAUNCHING OF NEW SPRING MARITIME FESTIVAL FOR THE GALSON ESTATE

Planning is underway for a brand new mini-festival, Fèis na Fairge, complementing our annual autumn heritage festival 'Dùthchas'. Dùthchas is our award-winning heritage festival which celebrates all aspects of our culture including the Gaelic language, music and traditional skills. The success of Dùthchas has inspired us to introduce a mini festival at the beginning of the Spring to encourage visitors to engage with the local community. The launch of Fèis A programme of events for Fèis na Fairge will align with the Scottish Government's themed 'Year of Coasts and Waters 2020'.

The focus on coasts and waters builds upon some of the ground-breaking work the Trust has undertaken to return control of the foreshore and seabed to the local community. In mid-2019 Urras Oighreachd Ghabhsainn entered in a joint bid with Comhairle nan Eilean seek the management powers to a local level. The joint bid was accepted on a pilot basis.

na Fairge is being planned. We aim to showcase our coast, its wildlife and the many skills, talents and heritage from our



marine and coastal environment. We hope it will also enable the community to further consider how to sustainably manage and conserve the marine environment, as well as enjoy and learn about their coastal home.
