#### **Deer Management**

Now that the sporting season is over, we are pleased to report that 59 deer were dispatched during the 2023/2024 shooting season. Our volunteers worked extremely hard this season, waking up in the small hours, battling the weather and trekking across the challenging, boggy terrain, all in their own time. We recognise the pressure our volunteers are under to carry out this role on behalf of the community and are appreciative of their commitment, effort and the personal equipment they have used.

There have been a further 15 (approximately) deer killed due to colliding with vehicles so please do take care when driving through the estate. Although we are working hard to manage deer numbers, there is always going to be a risk of deer crossing the roads. If you do hit a deer, please call UOG. We feed numbers and locations to the Lewis and Harris Deer Management Group, Nature Scot and Police Scotland. This evidence assists us with gaining our out of season shooting licenses and night licenses all which help us with the ongoing task of managing deer numbers.





#### **Corncrake Initiative**

The RSPB is still looking for entrants to the Corncrake Initiative Scheme. If you can leave your croft empty from the very beginning of April to mid August, then graze it in the winter or cut your silage after 1st August, you may be eligible to enter the scheme, in return for a payment. If you don't have stock and are still interested in the scheme, we could organise stock to graze it. #### JOHN MUIR TRUST P7 TRANSITION PROGRAMME

30 children from Sgoil an Taobh Siar, Lionel, Shawbost and Breasclete primary schools have been awarded their John Muir Trust Discovery Award, after spending three days exploring North West Lewis, as part of our primary seven transition programme, in partnership with Urras Oighreachd Chàrlabhaigh.

The primary seven pupils from the four primary schools spent three days, 19th – 21st March, exploring the outdoors, discovering new areas and activities, and learning how to protect and conserve our environment, led by a team of local experts.

The John Muir Trust Discovery Award is an environmental award scheme focused on encouraging people to connect with, enjoy and care for wild places.

During the three days, the school pupils went canoeing on Loch Barvas, mountain biking and litter picking along the Barvas machair, learnt survival skills in a woodland session in Shader, visited Arnol Blackhouse, as well as a trip to the Arnol fank to learn some crofting skills, and lots of other activities.

Here is what some of the children had to say about their experience:

"I learned new skills from the bush craft, and survival skills so I could survive in the wild."

"There are lots of things that you can find outdoors and without looking after the environment there wont be anything left to discover."

"I've met more people and made so many friends!"

"I feel more confident going to the Nicolson now."

"Canoeing was my favourite, because we all bonded and became friends."

Urras Oighreachd Ghabhsainn and Urras Oighreachd Chàrlabhaigh started the transition programme in 2020 to ensure that the P7 pupils from the four schools had a chance to meet one another before going to the Nicolson Institute, as well as learning about the area they come from and acquiring new skills.

#### **PLÒIGH**

Our Easter Plòigh was a success this year, with many of the activities selling out within the first couple of days of booking going live! Activities including model painting, bird watching, mountain biking, a movie afternoon, baking & crafts, woodland play and lots more, were attended by over 200 participants throughout the week. Plòigh provides subsidised activities during the holidays and the next Plòigh runs from 8th – 19th July 2024.

The Plòigh programme is a collaborative effort in partnership with Sporsnis, Taigh Dhonnachaidh, CnaG, RSPB, Clan MacQuarrie Community Centre, and Barvas & Brue Community Centre.









As we mentioned in our last newsletter, we are working in collaboration with Airidhantuim Community Council, Comunn Eachdraidh Nis and Galson Grazing Committee, to commemorate the centenary of the resettlement of Galson village. This historic endeavour, marking 100 years of transformation and community ownership, will culminate in the unveiling of a captivating memorial sculpture, 'na Dorsan', this Autumn.

Great progress has been achieved at Tom na Bà to deliver the first stage of works for na Dorsan. Construction of the gravel base kicked off in mid-March and, assisted by some dry spells of weather, contractor North West Aggregates from Borve has now completed these works. With suitable stone delivered to the site, this allows drystone dyker, Chris Barrowman, to begin construction of the circular stone walls soon.

This year's Dùthchas festival, which will take place over two weeks at the beginning of September, will focus on na Dorsan with a range of events including walks, talks and art workshops, as well as hosting the Simon Fraser Memorial Lecture with Community Land Scotland and Brian Wilson. Local schools will be also involved in a range of activities. Stay tuned for more information coming soon!









#### **Butt of Lewis Development**



As the number of tourists, and in particular cruise ship passengers, visiting the Isle of Lewis every year increases, we are keen to ensure that we are able to offer good facilities at spots across North Lewis, whilst also supporting local businesses. The latest developments, including a toilet block and plans for a food vendor pitch at the Butt of Lewis, are part of a long-term plan to expand tourism facilities throughout North Lewis.

The income generated from the campervan site at the Urras Oighreachd Ghabhsainn Business Centre has partially contributed to the purchase and installation of the toilet blocks at the Butt of Lewis, which will be opening very soon. We are also grateful to Highlands & Islands Enterprise for providing further funding for the development of the toilet block.

We are also keen to speak to local catering businesses who would be interested in pitching their catering truck at the Butt of Lewis during peak season, which we believe could be a profitable opportunity for someone.
